Lake Board Meeting

The Hardwood Lake Improvement Board has scheduled a meeting for 10 a.m. on Saturday, October 25 at the NEW Richland Township Hall. A representative from Progressive Engineering will be on hand to discuss past and future lake weed control.

The hall is located at Sheffer and McLean. To reach the hall go one mile south of Prescott on Sage Lake Road to Sheffer then turn east and go about 2 miles to McLean. Turn south and go about one-quarter mile.

Road Brining

The petition to put road brining of Hardwood Heights and Gillings Road on the tax rolls is short a few signatures. The deadline has passed to be able to get it on the tax rolls for the summer of 2004. An effort is being made to gather the remaining signatures needed for the summer of 2005. Currently the cost for three applications done in May, July and August (before the holidays) are \$45 for 250 feet and \$63 for 500 ft. Fish facts

EDITORS note: The following information on Hardwood Lake is from DNR Records. We will publish more information as space permits

Hardwood Lake is a 172 acre lake located in Richland Township. T21N, 4E, Sec 6. The lake was mapped in 1943, and was reported to have good winter fishing for pike and crappies, and good summer fishing for bass, crappies, perch and bluegills. Originally, the map showed that the lake connected to Johnson Lake, which drained into the AuGres River. This was an error. The outlet drains to Long Lake, via Silver Creek to the Rifle

Numerous cabins and residences surround the lake. Hardwood Lake has a maximum depth of 35 feet, but over 75% of the lake is less than 15 feet. The shoreline drops off steeply along the northern shore, and more gradually everywhere else. The surrounding countryside has some farms, hills, forests, and swamps. The immediate shoreline is wooded and hilly. The water color of Hardwood Lake has always been recorded as being dark brown. The bottom is a mixture of sand, pulpy peat, and detritus.

An early fish survey in 1954 showed Hardwood Lake to have abundant yellow perch, bullheads, black crappie, and largemouth bass. Bluegill, pumpkinseed sunfish, and northern pike were rated as fair in abundance. The panfish

were all on the small side. Northern pike, bass, and crappie were considered average. There was documentation of beaver problems in the lake's outlet.

Past files also indicate that the lake may have history of winter kill. A 1960 survey showed numerous small panfish and predators, but no large ones. Growth was noted as good, possibly recovering from winter kill. In 1978, there was a boom shocking survey to investigate another report of winter kill (1976-77). Again, abundant panfish were found and growth looked good. Bass and crappie were scarce, and no pike were taken. At this time management recommended stocking largemouth bass and operating a pike marsh.

A few home owners stated they had seen signs of Gypsy Moths. Jack Gregg, a surveyor in the area, investigated and found that there was not enough gypsy moth activity to warrant a spraying. He will stay involved with progress in the future and make necessary recommedations.


Windmill at McGregors

This summer Bob and Glenda McGregor had a windmill installed on their shore on the east end of the lake in the cove. It has an aerator underneath the water activated by the windmill which is propelled by the wind. The air that is bubbled up under the water may keep weeds from growing within an acre. So far it is working well. The cost was around \$1,400 including installation. **WARNING:** Snowmobilers be aware that there will be little or no ice in that area.


Birdhouses
