Living on the lake provides an opportunity to go boating, fishing or looking at the scenery. To make it more enjoyable, everyone should be aware of the rules and regulations.

Sometimes we or our guests forget or don't know the rules. Page 2 has a list of some State of Michigan laws you and your guests should be familiar with.

Road Brine Offered to Residents

Richland Township is offering area residents the opportunity to sign up for road brine which reduces dust on dirt roads. Applications are done in May (before Memorial Day), July 4th, and late August/early September (before Labor day). Costs are as follows:

Area residents that wish to have brine applied to unpaved roads in front of their homes should contact Wava Fisher at (989) 873-4436 to be set up for road brining.

The Hardwood Lake Property Owners Association will not be paying for brining this summer.

Boating Safety Rules and Regulations

Personal Flotation Device (PFD)

- You must have one Personal Flotation Device (PFD) for each person on board your boat. They must be US Coast Guard approved and be of the proper size for the person.
- If your boat is over 16 feet you must have a type 4 (throwable) PFD on board. This is usually a ring buoy or seat cushion. PFD's must be in good condition and readily available. That means they can not be stored inside cabins or storage areas.
- · Children under 6 MUST wear a type 1 or type 2 PFD when on a boat, unless they are inside a cabin area.

Personal Water Craft (PWC)

- A PWC is defined as a vessel you ride on as opposed to in. A PWC operator must obey all boating laws. There are additional laws just for PWC's.
- Each person riding on or towed behind a PWC must wear a PFD.
- · Children under 7 may not ride on a PWC unless with a parent, guardian or designee of a parent or guardian.
- You must be at least 14 years old and have a Boating Safety Certificate with you to operate a PWC. If you were born in 1979 or later you must have a Boating Safety Certificate with you to operate a PWC.
- PWC may **only** operate between the hours of 8 am to one hour before sunset.
- If operating at a greater than idle speed, a PWC must not cross within 150 feet behind another boat other than another PWC.

Direction of operation for all watercraft

You must operate your boat in a counter-clockwise direction on the lake.

Distance from shore, boats, rafts

If operating at a greater than idle speed you must stay 100 feet from a shoreline, a moored or anchored boat, a dock or raft, marked swimming area or a person in the water.

Hours of operation

High speed boating (the boat up on plane) is restricted to the hours between 11 am and 7:30 pm on Hardwood Lake.

Registration number


MC numbers must be on both sides of the forward half of the watercraft.

They must be in block letters at least 3 inches high and in contrasting color with the boat. Letters and numbers must be separated by a space or hyphen. Example MC 1234 ZW or MC-1234-ZW. No other numbers can be displayed on either side of the bow. The validation decal must be affixed to both sides of the boat three inches following the last character of the registration number.

We hope you have a safe and enjoyable time on Hardwood Lake. These boating safety tips are provided as a courtesy reminder for you by the Hardwood Lake Property Owners Association. Director, Gil Ezzo, passes


