Weed control and picnic successful

The lake association annual meeting was held on July 7. About a dozen residents attended. Clay Dees was reelected Vice President and Margo Dees retained the Secretary/Treasurer position. Other officers are elected in odd years.

President Kevin Ohlrogge discussed the algae boom project and Lake Board Representative Dave Sommers discussed the weed control project.

Lake Association continued

The weed control project will continue. After a couple of years of financial problems it was nice to have adequate funds. You may recall that the tax assessment was increased from \$185.64 to \$344 for front lots per year for the period of 2018 to 2021. Back lots are half that rate. The increase fist appeared on the 2017 winter tax bill.

There were four algae and weed control treatments in 2018 as well as a weed harvest. Lake weeds and algae were treated May 23, June 25, July 17 and August 27. Filamentous Algae was the main culprit while small areas of Milfoil, nuisance Wild Celerv and Starry Stonewort were treated.

On July 23 & 24

there was a weed harvest (right) with four harvester loads of weeds removed from

11.75 acres.

Lake treatment maps are posted on the web and can be found under the Late Breaking News button on the home



page. They are also posted on our Facebook page.

For the past few years there has been an in-

crease in algae in the lake. Chemical treatments were made but it didn't seem as if we could get ahead of it. Several east end residents said they would notice plumes of algae moving out of the swampy area in the northeast corner of the lake.

After research it was discussed that an "algae boom" be

ing said they had very limited data on the effectiveness of a boom for algae control.

At the July 2017 Association meeting the membership authorized the purchase and installation on a trial basis.

In May of 2018 the 100 foot long boom was installed by lake association board members.

Over the summer the algae issue was much better than it has been for the past few years. There could be several factors in this including weather, increased treatment or the boom.

Paul said he has seen quite a bit of algae this year in the numerous lakes he oversees around the state. He said the boom "appears to be doing a good job" but cautions it is too soon to make a determination.

The area has been monitored by drone surveillance throughout the summer.

Our own Dan Joseph, a competitive BBQ chef, did wonders with the pulled pork while


Debbie was the chicken master.
