
Lake Association continued

Weed control update

The ongoing weed control project got off to a late start this year because of the cool spring

There were five chemical treatments in 2019 with the first treatment on June 10. The primary treatments this year have been for algae, however various other weeds were treated including Eurasian milfoil, coontail, starry stonewort, water lillies and various nuisance plants. There was no weed harvesting in 2019.

Treatment maps and information is posted on the web under "Late Breaking News" and posted on Facebook.

Algae has become an increasing issue. A watershed analysis is being conducted to determine if there are additional nutrients flowing into the lake against the algae of



the lake causing the algae growth.

The lake weed control project is funded through a special assessment on your tax bill. The next Lake Board meeting will be Monday,
